# The Cyberpunks Reinvent Science Fiction

For the past ten years, science fiction has mean-dered along, often repetitive, boring, and banal. SF's staunchest defenders turned their backs on the genre, and the classics remained gathering dust on library shelves. But seemingly, out of nowhere, a new wave of authors has cropped up throughout the US. Young, knowledgeable, funny and mean, they've reinvented the product. The name they have chosen for themselves flaps in the air like a banner: Cyber for "cybernetics," a word which doesn't mean very much, but brings to mind the most advanced technologies and the green light of the computer screen; and punks because their style echoes that kind of rock music.

Cyberpunks. The term was coined, originally, by Gardner Dozois, an American writer, in an attempt to describe the work of William Gibson, whose novel, Neuromancer, was a great hit, winning three respected awards: the Hugo, the Nebula and the Philip K. Dick Award. The term was so successful that both William Gibson and many other authors, whose works were published in the last few years, claimed it for themselves. There is also a second Cyberpunk wave consisting of such writers as Jack Dann, John Shirley and Kim Stanley Robinson, amongst others. With its technologic and provocative connotations, cyberpunk faithfully expresses the new authors' ambitions. Their texts are fast, incisive, ironic and disconcerting, and relate time, reality, and changes that are being wrought in the present by new technologies and computer science.

Gone are the Galactic Empires, and consequently, the aggressive aliens and confused ETs.

They are replaced by a universe of synthesis, both precise and sardonic full of telematic pi-

rates, peripheral cyborgs and worlds that oscillate between laughter and frenzy, luck and amnesia, action and entropy. What better way is there to present these giants of this new and insolent fiction than letting them talk about their worlds.

#### GREG BEAR (Blood Music and Eon)

"I think that the term cyberpunk is an abomination and I don't recognize myself in that movement. The cyberpunks are revolutionary only in name, all they really care about is selling as many of their books as they can.... People like Gibson, Rucker and Sterling have a sensitivity which is much more European than mine. I feel much more American than they are, in the sense that I think I'm more egalitarian and more open in my options and choices.... Our perception of science and technology has changed a lot since a few years back. Science has become a major cultural success, a form of art, in its own way.... If I had been prevented from becoming a sciencefiction writer, I would have shot my brains out.... For the first time in history, with the advent of Reagan's I.D.S., science fiction has really had an impact on world politics, because I.D.S. has influenced politics, even though it doesn't yet exist.... I'm not ashamed of Reagan, but he worries me.... As a Democrat, I am ill at ease when I see that the Republicans have all the good ideas."

#### WILLIAM GIBSON (Neuromancer and Count Zero)

"I never studied science, but I use science and technology to conjure up new images, to create the surroundings and the atmosphere for my novels. I could say that I use scientific language in a poetic fashion. I'm a supplier of

popular icons... I have a feeling that we're living in an era of rapid changes and we don't realize what's happening. My work, consequently, consists of taking real, everyday life and transforming it into a fantasy, to make it more acceptable. In a sense, I deal more with social criticism than with future perspective.... My triple prize winning has made my existence a lot easier, but I have the impression that being widely accepted sort of neutralizes us one-time "angry young men." I don't think, however, that success has corrupted me.... I don't really belong to a group or to a school of thought—I am part of the generation of people, who have no special ties, but happened to land on the publishing world all at the same time. People have made up a dozen or so



words to try to define us. None has really satisfied me up 'til now."

RUDY RUCKER (Master of Space and Time, The Fourth Dimension, and The Secret Life, soon to be published.)

"Having studied so much science, I thought that becoming a science-fiction writer was an excellent way of taking advantage of these studies. Science fiction is a wonderful instrument with which to learn about the contemporary world.... decided to become a writer while I was listening to a Rolling Stones concert in Buffalo, in 1975. There was so much energy at that concert, that I decided that I wanted to express something as strong as that. Since I didn't play an instrument, I decided that I would write, and write science fiction, because all the world can read that.... I've always wanted to be an avant-garde artist, and create a sort of contorted science fiction, à la William Burroughs. The science fiction which came out of the seventies is drab and depressing. In my stories and novels, I have sometimes resorted to gimmicks like flying saucers or superpowers because I find that they work a bit like ideanrame I know thou're ridiculous and I try





very hard to use them with a lot of humor.... There was a time when I liked to think of my work as coming from 'transrealism.' 'Transrealism' lets the writer transcend reality by means of science-fiction archetypes and end up with a concept close to the one favored by the postmoderns—the world is no more a logical space and cannot be defined in those terms. Today the world is made up of information.... The word cyberpunk doesn't bother me because it calls attention to this movement, which I think is a good one. What matters, nowadays, is to break all barriers that might come up between things and let information flow through them. This is why the term cyberpunk is interesting to me, because it brings together two concepts apparently very distant from each other, and this association produces information."

the Dragon, The Jaguar Hunter and Green Eyes)

"I hate the term cyberpunk—I find it totally ridiculous. They've pinned it on me, but I've never had anything to do with computers. As for the cyberpunk movement, the only thing one can really say about it is that there is no ideological or stylistic unity within the group. Besides, most of the people who belong to it have a style that would frighten away just about everyone. The cyberpunks spend their time writing manifestos, but I've noticed that politics are completely absent from their work.... All this new science fiction really is, is a group of people who all know each other and spend a lot of time observing each other. And it's true that I like to know what the others are doing.... There will always be cycles in science fiction, there always have been, ever since the genre began. What is worthy of notice is that politics are starting to make a comeback, at least on the East Coast and in California. But the problem is that there is no 'cause' in the U.S. The people here just live, and couldn't care less when you tell them about what's happening in Central America....To be perfectly honest, I must say that I'm not particularly enthusiastic about science fiction. And I didn't even try to sell a story before 1983. I went to my first convention that year, and I really went because of my girlfriend. I was totally astounded because never before had I seen such an enormous number of authors completely drunk.... Speaking in political terms, one may say that American science fiction nowadays is alobally centrist. Sci-

ence doesn't really interest me. When I read scientific articles or I write about science fiction, my eyes become all glassy. And I really don't know how science came to be part of my novels. Every time I have to research some scientific fact, I get depressed. I don't know any scientists, I see mostly musicians and neighbors, one of whom is a basketball player from Puerto Rico.... I'm involved in militant activities because Reagan's politics in Central America and Nicaragua make me puke-about 80% of what I write has a political theme."


BRUCE STERLING (The Sand Whale, The Artificial Kid and Schismatrix.)



ciation for the Advancement of Science) and I spend most of my time reading scientific magazines from all over the world.... As J.G. Ballard used to say, we have to know how to use the contents of our waste paper baskets, because there's where we find 'invisible' literature: scientific reports, technical reports, manuals on how to utilize magnetoscopes, etc.... In the sixties, when new wave reached science fiction, the authors who belonged to the movement had only rage and anger as their weapons, and they met with a lot of resistance. When we arrived on the scene, science fiction was so decrepit that it was very easy for us to come to the fore.... Our movement is part of the post-modern movement, and within it there are two different tendencies: the cyberpunks and the humanists. The cyberpunks write mainly about high-tech, while the humanists are interested in problems pertaining to language. The post-modern movement was born in '83-'84, and it's quite schizoid, similar to all the other pop movements which preceded it. It goes against what I call "mainstream" science fiction, that is to say, all the oldies.... Reagan





makes me sick. I feel ashamed of him in front of my foreign friends, especially since he came up with I.D.S. Moreover, what can you expect from a president who has learned all he knows by reading Edgar Rice Burroughs and who only has about three or four neurons still in function?.... Counter-culture's only chance for survival is to branch out as much as possible, because it's just impossible to resist the wave of high-tech which is coming toward us. The idea of a return to nature makes me puke."

MICHAEL SWANWICK (Saint Janis Blues, In the Drift, Ginungagap, and The Kiss of the Masque.)

"When our generation made itself known, the quarrel between old and new wave had come to an end, which enabled us to use the old and colorful science-fiction images and apply to them the techniques and ambitions of the new wave because the dominant trait of our generation is ambition: the ambition to produce an honest, serious, intelligent and entertaining work.... Our predecessors in the U.S.? Delany and Zelazny .... Science fiction's greatest ambition is, in my opinion, to fight against the dominant trait of current popular literature: regionalism.... I'm a 'fringe cyberpunk,' which means I place myself between them and the 'humanists,' and I have friends in both camps.... Post-modernism is still too small a thing in science fiction to be called a movement or a school. It's really only a group of people who all know each other and write books which have nothing in common with what preceded them.... I'm no techno-fetishist, but I find it impossible to escape, nowadays, from science and technology. I don't try to run away from it. I'm about to buy a computer.... My art was born in the sixties. I was then a sort of desperado, a freak, if you prefer, as were many of the people who belong to this movement. We fought against the Vietnam war, against the establishment, etc. But the sixties movement disappeared with Watergate. We were on our way to discover something. When I realized that we wouldn't ever get to our destination, I got out of it. And what I learned from that was that the good people are not all on one side and the bad on the other, and that western society is something much more complicated.... My life is writing. Science fiction offers me great opportunities, compared to 'mainstream,' however, if one day I find out that these opportunities are turning into obstacles, then I will start writing literature."
