


## GETTING TO KNOW YOU DEPT.

# VISITING NEW ENGLAND

### Historical Landmarks And Places Of Interest



NEW ENGLAND is a wonderful place to visit. The natives here will welcome you with open arms, particularly if your English isn't too broken, and you don't look too European. However, these little faults will be quickly overlooked the minute you start spending money. The native New Englander is famous for his shrewd business dealings, which is fondly referred to in local jargon as "Yankee Trading", and commonly known in legal terms as "Swindling." 

# VISITING THE MIDWEST

## A Little About The Area And The People



IF YOU WANT to enjoy the beauties of spectacular mountain ranges, great expanses of forests, and breath-taking rock formations, then we suggest you skip the Midwest and go on to the next section. However, if you want to get to the heart of America, then you should go to the Midwest. Because it's just about in the center of the country.

There are many rivers in the Midwest, foremost of which are the Mississippi, the Missouri, the Ohio, and the Potowmack Mill Creek. 









# EDUCATIONAL TOYS
