HOW TO DRAW COMICS THE NEW YORKER WAY

SCRIVENER'S AND FUNGI PUBLISHING, 328 PAGES, \$22.95

There are only a handful of uniquely American art forms, like jazz or bumfighting. Foremost among these is the classic *New Yorker* gag cartoon.

Urbane, droll, mostly embalmed, the best of these inscrutable comic situations let their wry subtleties unfold with a delicious slowness. Lots of slowness. The subtleties can often go unnoticed by the casual reader...and certain members of the magazine's editorial staff...and indeed the creators themselves.

At last, the previously opaque and inexplicable formula of the New Yorker cartoon has been broken down for the aspiring contributor. How to Draw Comics the New Yorker Way is a profusely illustrated tutorial that takes a step-by-step approach.

The New Yorker can sometimes seem like a closed shop, in which the same cartoonists appear, week after week, with fresh vacancies being created only by death. But this simply isn't true. The magazine has a backlog of material from many of its dead artists who continue to monopolize New Yorker space, decades after their bones have rotted.

And yet they teach by example. Seeing the way different artists handle the exact same situation is, for lack of a better word, fascinating. The book includes more than 400 office gags showing a boss having a phone conversation at his desk, and from every possible cartooning angle (three). But the tiny differences in stippling, or the choice of background graytone wash? Those sing volumes.

The book is a cornucopia of valuable "tricks of the trade." For example, always draw one character with an open mouth (or in the highly technical jargon, the "speaker"). You don't want the reader to think your cartoon is about telepaths.

When drawing your 300th cartoon depicting a father sitting in a high-backed chair giving implausible, matter-of-fact advice to a child, you may be tempted to vary the object placement. Perhaps by reversing the father and the chair, putting the chair on top. The book explains the drawbacks to this.


One of the more useful chapters gives tips on potential subject matter. (Hint: The readership simply can't get enough talking dogs.) Children acting like adults! Adults acting like children! Animals acting like children OR adults! And all of them behaving with incongruous detachment! It's laugh-not-loud pandemonium!

It's impossible to underrate the cultural importance of the *New Yorker* cartoon, especially the pointless ones with the short, squiggly king just walking around. These cartoons aren't there merely to fill the space between the overview of the



new Frank Stella retrospective at MOMA, and the 14 pages of prose about a Connecticut writer who hates his novel, his wife, his mistress, and himself. They're a fundamental piece of our collective literary tradition. A lot of craft goes into taking whatever catchphrase has been in the public arena lately, and having a sommelier at a wine tasting say it. Or the Grim Reaper. Or a cow.

This book is highly recommended for anybody who's always dreamed of drawing ink wash cartoons about board meetings for the rest of their lives. Whether you hope to appeal to the reader that lives on East 66th Street in Manhattan, or the one on 73rd Street, you'll learn the professional tricks that have produced thousands of imperceptible half-chuckles, furrowed brows, contemplative grimaces, and even the occasional flared nostril.
