So say we all, Dennie! We appreciate your kind words, tiger, and to answer your question - we manage to scare up an old copy or two of our mags by scrounging around our storerooms - and then, when we find them, we photograph the printed pages. But, that's only the beginning! We then have to retouch all the grey tones that appear in the photos and perform about a zillion other technical tasks on the artwork before it can be sent to the printer! (Those who sometimes claim we reprint yarns to save money are completcly wrong! It would be cheaper — and easier — to do the job over completely — but we'd feel as though we're cheating you. In our opinion, one of the main features of an older reprint story is the fact that you can enjoy looking at the artwork exactly as it originally appeared! Right?)

Dear Stan and John,
I have chosen to direct my criticism towards SPIDER-MAN #41. The most protuberant fallacy of this issue concerns the sound effects. In most instances the errors were commonplace and insignificant and can be over-looked, but you seem to have developed a monomania about "Stomp"! Undoubtedly there are effects other than 'Stomp" which could have been used to herald the ponderous Rhino's approach, to evidence his progress. You could have used even the simplest of effects, such as "Clomp" or "fromp" to break this monotonous continuance, but you monomaniaes persisted in maintaining the ance, but you monomaniaes persisted in maintaining the same sound effect from the time of the Rhino's debut to the juncture of his defeat. "Stomp" appears for the first time in panel 7 of page 5. It occurs again in panel 2 of page 6. Going on, however, on the same page in the third panel, you have a "Throom" and another "Stomp". In panel 4 it is encountered again, and it also recurs twice in the first panel of page 7. Then, it recrudesces in panel 8 of page 10, and so on, I counted 15% "Stomp's" in all. (In panel 5 of page 12 one of your "Stomp's" wasn't completely written gut! The pally other severe sound effects pletely written out.) The only other severe sound effects inexpedience incorporates a defection in the dialogue. These occur in panels 2 and 1 on page 12 and 15 respectively. The above said inexpediency consists of your representation of police car sirens. In both instances you use several "E's" to indicate the approach of the minions of the law. "EEEEE!" What does that sound like, other than a hysterical female? Did the constabulary have a bunch of screaming women sitting on top of the cars? Really, try to be a little more instrospective, will you? How about something like "WIRRIPTRRT?"? You chaps had better get to work on that sort of thing. Well, I hope you will resolve these things, at the same time maintaining your unparalled standards in the lesser concerns, such as plot and art. After all, it's the little things that count!




