isn't his only trick. He's also our resident photographer. He took the stunning photo which graced the cover of Dazzler #21 - as well as most of the other photos that have appeared in Marvel Comics in recent years. If a photo isn't credited otherwise, chances are it's Eliot's work. should mention, too, that Eliot is our resident technical expert. If something's broken, he can fix it - if something's complicated, he can explain it - if you've got a problem, he can solve it. He draws - and he's especially good at technical drawing, like blueprints, diagrams, cutaways, mechanical drawing - he inks, he colors, he designs, he does boardwork, and other stuff, too, that I can't think of. Best of all, he's a real trouper who's stayed here at the office all night many times helping desperate artists and editors make deadlines. He's probably blushing now, as he typesets this - he's such a humble guy!
