Just had to drop you a note to thank you for the warm, whimsical, excellent story in Spidey #246. The cover was hysterical and the art excellent. But I want to comment on the story.

It was very funny, but sensitively, sort of ruefully funny. I laughed with it rather than at it. Rather than simply lampooning the daydreamers, the story sympathized with them and revealed a lot about their characters, as well (not an easy trick!). The Black Cat wishes for flash and adventure, but rather superficially, no? Bodes ill for a relationship with our more serious hero. J. J. dreams of a sort of macho glory (not for the first time, either). I especially liked the longer, wavier hairdo he sported as the story progressed. And his jogging later, with

Spidey wondering why the sudden fitness kick, qualifies for best throw-away gag in some time. Mary Jane dreams of her own glory, in decidedly "artsy" terms (Woody Allen and Warren Beatty, I love it!), only to awaken on a somber note (soon to be explored, I've no doubt). And Spidey him-self? Why, dreaming of acceptance, of course. Perfect!

Finally, the skinny kid episode at the end is classic (indeed mythic - touches the skinny kid in each of us, even us not-soskinny kids!). If only he knew, right?




