





So far all you Marvelites out there whose appetites have been whetted by the covers for AMAZING #261 and WEB #1, we thought we'd clue you in on the fact that the redoubtable Mr. Vess is hard at work on a TALES OF ASGARD Graphic Novel! Yep, it looks like there'll be more than enough of Charlie's stunning work to satisfy everyonel

Dear Tom and Danny, AMAZING SPIDER-MAN #260 was another fine issue; Torn DeFalco has proven to be an unusually sensitive scriptwriter, and a worthy successor to Roger Stern. The deft interplay of subplots is handled as smoothly as I've ever seen, and the Frenz / Rubenstein team is wonderful. The nicest touch is the reinstatement of the round Spider-Man emblem on the splash pages.

However, I do have one concern about the Hobaoblin. This issue, Robbie refers to Pete and Lance Bannon, wondering where they are. This comment overlaps a cut back to Spider-Man's battle with Hobgoblin, answering the question of Peter's whereabouts ironically. The scene change doesn't tell us where Lance is, though - or

does it?

Is the irony here meant to suggest that Lance Bannon is secretly the Hobgoblin? Frankly, I hope not. Lance has hitherto been a very realistic character, and besides, from all the indications, the Hobgoblin is a much older man, in his 40's or 50's. I hope that you and Roger Stern have conferred, Tom, so that all clues to the Hobgoblin's identity are uniform. Until the secret is revealed, though, I'll just hope that this was a red herring.

After all, if the Hobgoblin is really Lance Banon, that spoils my latest guess at

Hobby's identity:

What if Peter Parker's father is still alive? Well, it was just an idea. But I guess that riff's been done with Darth Vader. Oh.

well . In closing, let me express my dismay at the impending cancellation of MARVEL TEAM-UP. Who cares if you're replacing it with WEB OF SPIDER-MAN?
