I've been asked by a couple of comics dealers to reprint an item I ran a few years ago explaining what the different markings on Marvel covers mean. Okay . . .

SEEN ONE YOU SEEN 'EM BOTH DEP'T. Many collectors have inquired about the two different types of covers they've seen on Marvel Comics. One type has the price, date, issue number, and some strange numbers and symbols in little boxes, like this:



Another has the price, date, and issue number in an "M" shape like so:



The reason for the two different covers is that our comics are circulated two different ways. Some reach the public via the Curtis Circulation Company and a network of Independent Dis-tributor Wholesalers who service newsstands, drugstores, 7-11's, and other magazine outlets

These comics go directly to comics specially shops and other locations not serviced by 1.0. Wholesalers. Since these comics aren't handled by Curlis, they don't need the funny little numbers and can't carry the Curlis seal—hence the arthul Mesign, which so beautifully sets off the remaining into. Clever, huh? That's the scoop.

Apparently, some collectors were worned that the one type might be less valuable as collect-ables than the other type, or that the little boxes covers were "reprint" or vice versa. Well, how covers were "reprint" or vice versa. Well, how much our comics are worth as collectors items really is up to you guys. Only in the marketplace can the value of a collectorable be determined. We can tell you that the comics with both types of covers are printed at the same time, on the same presses, that neither type is a "reprint" of the other, and that except for the cover markings, the comics are identical in every way. All clear?

# VIEW FROM THE TENTH FLOOR

Jim Shooter has left for a convention on the west coast. Tom DeFalco has been left in charge of Marvel until Jim returns. Within 24 hours of Jim's departure, Tom has earned for himself the highly coveted title of "Mr. Warmth." Easily, Hands down.

As Executive Editor, Tom's position is, essentially, to lord it over the editors and handle day to day emergencies for Jim while Jim is conquering worlds, slashing red tape, and pushing everyone to make Marvel four times as good as the next guy (instead of our usual as good as the next guy (instead of our usual three). With Jim's warm, friendly buffering influence away in California, we're left with pure, unbridled DeFalco. Let me give you an example of what I mean.

Imagine Ghengis Khan having a bad day. Imagine J.R. Ewing or Alexis Carrington Colby Dexter ... only really nasty.
