It's good to see that somebody other than Todd can draw Venem well. Erik did an excellent job on the character, especially the torn edgings of Venom's eyes. Speaking of eyes, Erik also likes to play with the eyes on Spidey's mask, which allows for more expression. This has been done before (notably by John Byrne and Ed Hannigan) but not as effectively.

Two other points on this issue:

First, the dialogue in the Spidey books (especially this one) is far too cluttered with old plot synopses. I appreciate that you have to introduce characters, motivations, and situations to newer readers, but nobody thinks plot breakdowns like Spidey does. I'd prefer to see the synopsizing done at the beginning of the book, with a small box introducing all the characters etc. to newer readers.

Second, it's and old complaint, but please don't use death to sell comics. "Next issue: Someone dies! Makes me want to . . . run out and buy a million copies. Or it should. How about, "Next issue: Everybody lives happily ever after!" Sigh, the human condition.

On the future, look at a pattern I've noticed to help shove Venem Into the big time of Spidey villains: the Burglar (Uncle Ben), Dr. Octopus (Bennett Brant and Captain Stacy), Green Goblin (Gwen Stacy), Venom (Nathan Lubensky).

And finally, the Sinister Six? Ignoring the fact that most of them hate each other, Kraven's dead and the Sandman's reformed, I count two replacements needed. So the original Sinister Six it won't

I have a question about Venem from issue #\$32. The alien costume has always been portrayed as a parasite that only takes and never gives.

In the issues of AMAZING SPIDER-MAN when Peter wore the black costume, he felt weak and his body was under its control. In a recent issue of WHAT IF-? the creature grafted itself on three heroes. With each case, the hero was physically drained. Peter's body was degenerated to that of an elderly man's. All power was transferred from the Hulk into Banner. A god, Thor, experienced great pain when it tried to graft itself to him.

Why does Brock seem to only benefit from the alien? There are never scenes of it animating Brock's body when he is asleep. Frequently, Brock has said that the alien is the real power behind Venom. I can't understand why it increases when it should be taking strength from him when he isn't fighting it still doesn't make sense. The alien took only a few months to drain all strength from Peter in WHAT IF-? Since Brock isn't naturally super-powered, the creature should have killed him by now. I think.

Always keep one thing in mind, Marc-the stories in WHAT IF-? are alternate realities. The alien costume in the tale you are referring to was explained as a parasite, but the one in this reality is a symbiote (as Reed Richards explained way back in issue #258). A symbiote shares a symbiotic relationship with its host, taking only what it needs and giving something back in return. Also, re-read THE SAGA OF THE ALIEN COSTUME, and you'll be surprised to learn that the alien costume actually fueled Spider-Man with extra strength on numerous occasions. Also remember that Brock understands the nature of his relationship with the symbiote-Spidey never did.
