One thing you won't want to pass by is GROC THE WANDERER, the hilarious barbarian comic that reminds us just how funny cheese dip is. Starting with issue #87, GROC will only be available in comics specialty shops and by subscription. GROC-creator Sergio Aragones (not to be confused with fashion designer Sergio Valenti) was concerned that his loyal newstand readers wouldn't be able to find GROC, so he asked us to mention it here on the page. That's why Sergio did that GROC illustration for the BP page last month, although we forgot to tell you why till this month! Guess we committed a GROC-ism!
