overall characterizations have been rather dull of late, giving us the same old rehash of past issues, with the portrayal of Mary Jane being unforgivable at best. Not since Gwen Stacy has there been a supporting character of this stature, but it would seem the Powers-That-Be are determined to screw her up.

I'm also totally unintrigued by the Richard/Mary Parker subplot. They were more interesting dead.

I am, however, enjoying Mark Bagley's work here. His Spidey is strongly reminiscent of the Ross Andru/John Romita days and is second only to Steven Butler's rendition. While I enjoy Sal Buscema's and Alex Saviuk's versions over on SPECTACULAR and WEB, this is the Spider-Man I grew up on.

The only other redeeming quality of recent issues has been the J.M. DeMatteis back-ups, and "The Web" was certainly no exception. While Aunt May has always been among the more prominent of the Spidey cast, she has also been one of the least developed on a personal level, and this look into her past was greatly appreciated.
