Her flying is simply her gaining greater control over her abilities (think of Banshee or Siryn over in the X-MEN books), traveling on sonic waves through the air. And the name discrepancy can be chalked up to Shriek not giving her real name right away. Remember, we don't know the circumstances that first brought her to Ravencroft. People have spent months in hospitals as "John or Jane Doe."

But we're glad to hear you enjoyed the issue, and we'll be happy to keep making yours Marvel!


