# CREATOR PROFILE: JOHN OSTRANDER

Need to hire a hero? JOHN OSTRANDER is the man to call! He's the writer for our all-new HEROES FOR HIRE series! We asked this writer for hire a few questions about how he got ahold of the unlisted number for LUKE CAGE and Co.! (And, even more importantly, are the Heroes for Hire available for yardwork?)

WHAT CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT HERCES FOR HIRE? It's unlike anything else I've written. I'm having loads of fun with it. I'm trying to make the electricity level real high. It's a real fun ride.

IS THERE A ROTATING CAST OF CHARACTERS IN THE BOOK? Yes. There is a solid core to the group, and then guest stars who rotate in and out. Our guest stars could technically come from anywhere in the Marvel Universe.

WHO ARE THE CORE HEROES? LUKE CAGE (POWER MAN), IRON FIST, the BLACK KNIGHT and the new WHITE TIGER (who's female). Each member has their own agenda for being on the team. There is a mystery for each one of them.

YOU MEAN THEY'RE NOT JUST OUT TO MAKE A BUCK? They're not just mercenaries. I don't want to focus on the "for hire" as much as I do the "heroes."

WHO ARE SOME OF THE GUEST STARS WHO SHOW UP IN THE BOOK? The HULK is in the first issue, HERCULES is in it for a while...

DIDN'T ROGER STERN WORK ON THE FIRST ISSUE? Yeah. Actually, what happened was, Roger Stern created the whole thing, but then he had to bow out, and he suggested that I replace him. THE PUNISHER had just been cancelled, and MARK BERNARDO, who was the editor of that, was also editing HEROES FOR HIRE. He had no problems working with me. Roger Stern basically plotted the first issue and I basically scripted it. My friend Joe Edkin assisted me.

WHO ARE SOME OF THE VILLAINS WHO WILL BE SHOWING UP IN THE BOOK? The U-FOES, THE CONTROLLER, the MASTER OF THE WORLD – he'll be a continuing heavyweight for us. ORKA, SHOCKWAVE, WHIPLASH, KILLER SHRIKE, NITRO.

IF YOU COULD ONLY HIRE ONE HERO, WHICH ONE WOULD YOU HIRE? Probably IRON MAN, because he has the most flexibility for the most types of work. If I lived in the Marvel Universe, I'd know he was for hire, because he works as a bodyguard.

HOW DO YOU LIKE THE ART OF PASCUAL FERRY? He has enormous enthusiasm. I'm throwing all kinds of different things at him — issue #2 takes place on the mystic Isle of AVALON. Pascual has a nice range of ability.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO HIRE A HERO? As little as a dollar! It's a sliding fee based on the client's ability to pay.

WHO ARE SOME OF YOUR FAVORITE WRITERS? I like some of Robert Parker's Spenser novels... Shakespeare... Barbara Tuchman – she's a historian. Raymond Chandler. Dashiell Hammett.

HOW ABOUT COMIC BOOK WRITERS? Certainly STAN LEE — the way he would start his plots in the middle of the action. With HEROES FOR HIRE, I'm trying to be Stan Lee on extra caffeine! PETER DAVID is one of the best in the business. He took a character I found stagnant — the Hulk — and showed that you can do so many different things with him. MARK GRUENWALD did some wonderful things — I'm glad they're reprinting SQUADRON SUPREME.

HOW DID YOU GET STARTED WRITING COMICS? I come from a theater background. In the early eighties, a friend of mine was starting up a comic book company. He knew of my work as a playwright, and knew of my interest in comics. He gave me a shot, and I've never looked back. I've been doing it for about fifteen years now.
