The Rose's primary enforcer, she is a superpowered woman who has been set on the trail of Spider-Man several times, though she has failed to destroy him.



THE BLACK TARANTULA


A shadowy South American crimelord who has apparently lived for centuries. The Tarantula has come to New York to personally try and take control of the city's criminal element.

The Black Tarantula's chief lackey.



I realize that it is vital for you to come up with new characters (okay, so the Rose is not all that new—he's still newer than Electro), when they don't measure up, they just make the classic villains look that much better.

While the return of a really coul villain made ASM #423 the best Spider-Man book in a while, the story was still bogged down by too many subplots. Don't get me wrong, Spider-Man has always had a high degree of soap opera, and I'm not suggesting that you turn him into a two-dimensional fighting machine. Recently, however, there have been so many subplots that Spider-Man occasionally seems like a guest star in his own book. Still, a colorful villain like Electro is just the thing to kick-start this book back on the right track. I certainly hope that we can expect more of the same in the future.

I don't usually like the results when an artist or writer tries to update or revamp a classic Spidey foe, but the changes experienced by Electro in AMAZING SPIDER-MAM #423 were exceptionally well conceived and executed. Electro has long been one of my favorite Spidey villains, right up there with Doc Ock, Green Goblin and Sandman.

The idea of having Electro be able to tap into the Earth's electromagnetic forces was truly inspired. Not only does this perhaps offer the opportunity for there to be some big differences in the way Spidey handles Electro, it also has good comic book logic.

The fact that it makes Electro incredibly powerful is also a nice touch. I won't say it makes him invincible, because I have faith that the webhead will eventually find away to defeat the new and improved Electro, hopefully by using his scientific intelligence rather than just brute force.

I also appreciated attention that was given to Joe Robertson's character. Lots of people have written stories that included a role for Robbie, but no one has ever really explored the nature of the relationship between Robbie and Jonah Jameson. It appears from the scenes he had in this issue that at long last the spotlight will be turned on that aspect of his character. I just hope it doesn't end up costing him his marriage to Martha, although that is a realistic and all too common side effect in real life of the kind of devotion Robbie has for Jonah and the Daily Bugle.

Getting to see Delilah and Dragorfily again was nice, as I think these ladies have the same kind of interesting story potential that the Black Cat had back when she was first introduced, although I don't see either of them ending up fighting for the good guys. They are still fascinating characters.

Another fascinating character I'd like to see more of in the conics, one who has showed up recently on the Spider-Man animated series, is Madanue Web. a can't recall ever learning about he rorigin or her underlying motives in helping Spidey. She has such an aura of mystery about her that I think she could be the inspiration for some very interesting stories.

Finally, I want all of you at Spidey HQ to know i am enjoying the post-clone Spidey stories nearly as much as I did the pre-clone stories. Keep up the good work and I will aventually be able to completely crase the clone years from my memory.


