
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

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

I'm enjoying the storylines coming from you concerning Peter. I just don't understand why you continue to ignore his scientific aspect as Spider-Man. During the period of time when Peter and Mary Jane were in Portland. I was reminded of Pete's love of science while he was employed with GARID during SPIDER-MAN: THE FINAL ADVENTURE. Anybody who eniovs science this much would come up with something to add to his arsenal long beforehand. I mean, Ben Reilly has had a bigger impact on Spider-Man's equipment in one year than Peter has in over 30. Ben's contribution of the impact webbing was a giant leap in preparing his alter-ego for persistent opponents that come back new and improved

Doc Ock is back for one issue, #428, and now he has a force field. Ock already has a good advantage with the four mechanical arms he used to demolish an entire block in his return. Now, this force field makes him darn near unbeatable. We've seen several of Spidey's opponents get an upgrade in their power level, such as Electro. Mysterio, Shocker, and now Doc Ock. If some of these guys are adding to their arsenals, then Pete should, too.

Peter should either incorporate Ben's design into his webbing or come up with his own ideas. Peter is a scientist first and foremost, and scientists have a tendency to adjust to adversarial situations or people that oppose them. Let's deal with specifics:

Doc Ock: The respect/understanding he showed for Spidey back during "Web Of Death" may have gone for good if he truly does blame of Webhead for what happened to Angelina. That would be a shame, since it was a nice twist for the bad guy to view his main enemy as a challenge and their battles as "wars of wits, rather than the usual hero/villain grudge matches. Still, his anger could make him more deadly than ever, and that'll be worth seeing!

Steve Skroce: I really appreciate his radical, innovative scenes. Delilah's head carving a spider shape out of the wall, Spidey ramming Doc Ock in a car, and diving through the windshield instead of simply leaping away—these are memorable. They stick in your mind, and to me, that's a sign of a class comic book.

Jacob Connover: He's the Rose, right? Right??? (Wrong?)

Shantal: Outspoken, Independent, A keen advocate of women's rights. And destined (I hope!) for a confrontation with a certain Peter Parker! A war of words between them is surely inevitable: they have opposing arguments and yet they're both partly right (Pete spends as much time as he can with MJ, but can't ignore his Spidey responsibilities: Shantal, not appreciating his dilemma, thinks Pete's thoughtless and neglectful). They can both give as good as they get, and any argument could be the most interesting meeting since a hungry Galactus called 'round

The finale: It was good to see Pete there for the climax, rather than Spidey, since the mask is nothing without the man behind it. And despite colorist Bob Sharen's cheeky attempt to trick us by coloring Jill's hair blonde, it was fun to see Pete alone with Jill Stacy. You've given us absolutely zero reason to think this, but...l can't shake the feeling that something is gonna happen there!

Between ASM and PETER PARKER. SPIDER-MAN, we're finally getting some development on the Stacy front. In fact, the entire ultra-intriguing civilian cast is enjoying major enhancement at the moment-and for as long as I've been reading, that's what I've really



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
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
