I just wanted to send a few quick words to the Spider's Web in regards to AMAZING SPIDER-MAN #4. I enjoyed the issue very much. The good of Fantastic Four are what originally got me interested in comics way back when, so a quest appearance in Spidey's mag is a great thing.

I must point out that I prefer John Byrne's pencils to be inked by himself, like the material I've been enjoying in the SPIDER-MAN: CHAPTER ONE limited series. This is strictly my opinion though, and this takes nothing away from Scott Hanna's obvious skill. I hope you can hold onto this particular creative team for a long time and not just a half-year to get the series started.

My complaint with issue #4 is the giant splash page on pages two and three. Spidey's narrative leads one to believe that this scene will be taking place later in the comic, but all we really see later is the Thing punching out the Sandman and the Trapster getting stuck to him. Also, the battle on those pages seems to take place on the street whereas the short scuffle later on clearly takes place on a rooftop.

Am I being too picky? Maybe, It's just that little things like this tend to bother me, even though they may have no direct effect on the direction of the story or the quality of the art.


