





















I just wanted to let you know that I really enjoyed the 100-page Monster, aka AMAZING SPIDER-MAN #20. The return of Alistair Smythe is deadly enough, but you know he's gonna have his latest batch of Spider-Slavers in tow, as well. This was a novel twist, though, sending all of the previous Slayers against our intrepid hero at once. This story sets up events for #21 nicely. What in the world does Smythe have planned for Peter next issue? Ov. the mind races with nossibilities!

It was interesting the way Howard Mackie had Peter so focused on his own problems that he didn't realize Jonah was going through struggles of his own. However, Jonah's as tight-lipped about his feelings as he is tightpocketed with his wallet, so how was Peter to know that, courtesy of Alistair, Marla and John were in danger? I've always found it amazing (no pun intended) how Spidey's writers can

make JJJ surlier and grumpier than normal when he is crawl-on-your-knees-and-beg-for-Mama frightened. Not only that, he is one of the biggest milquetoasts in the history of comics. Once again, Jonah is shown here as being "just a weak and ordinary man" (as the Jolly one himself stated in ASM #192, showcased in this mammoth offering). This is what makes J. Jonah Jameson one of the most fascinating, most perplexing characters in the entire Marvel Universe.


