As a loooongtime Spidey fan (first issue was Conway's ASM #113--yikes--that's a lotta years ago!) I cannot believe this is the first time I have felt compelled to write in to an editor/creator for any reason.

But, you see, I know and respect what a heavy burden you have taken on and what a jarring change there has been in the books over the past year. And, as the old saying goes: only a baby with a wet diaper welcomes change!

But, the truth is, these changes on Spidey

were needed and long overdue. In my opinion, he had strayed way too far from his humble, streetlevel roots into an occasionally entertaining but generally joyless hero. I can safely say I have enjoyed the last 8 months of stories more than I have any Spidey stories in decades, yes, decades.

I hope you plan to stay the course and not cave in to the naysayers (who, of course, cry the loudest) and panic over some readers who have left the book. My belief is this title is already picking up new readers with the currently excellent NWTD arc and will settle into a healthy enough sales pattern soon.
