Thank you for making Amazing such a friendly neighborhood for Spidey-fans! From the moment I read Brevort's Spider-Manifesto of '06, I had hope that it was going to be a great time to read Amazing Spider-Man. And it truly has heen

Amazing is the first comic I read each week, usually right outside the store, no matter what "event" book is getting all the attention at the time. When I read it, I am transported back to my childhood, when Spidey was dating the Black Cat, a mysterious goblin menaced the city, and you could read the classic LeeDitks/Romita stories in the anages of Marvel Table.

The Amazing team obviously knows and loves Spidey as much as I do. At its worst, Amazing is comfort food, the one comic I know I can rely on even if everything else that

week is disappointing. At its best, it has me giggling at a joke or the latest twist, or indignant that I might have to wait a week or two to find out what happens next. Occasionally, I am stunned, as with the fate of the DB.
