And now onto your letters regarding Pete getting "fired" for faking photos in issue #623-624:

Dear Spider-Man crew.

Peter was completely wrong, on the secondlo-last page of Amazing Spider-Man 624 when he thought "...l. can't clear myself without revealing who are under this mask." He may be thinking that what he did was "stuple", but it was at more than stupleit was a gross breach of his professional ethics. He cannot be "cleared". He cannot be excused. He actually did doctor a news photograph. That was completely unacceptable. even if the doctored photograph was telling a true story, and Jonah was absolutely correct to denounce him.

Peter Parker is supposed to be one of the most ethical characters in the Marvel Universe. In this instance, he did not live up to his catchphrase—"With great power must also come great responsibility." In this instance, he had more power with his professional reputation as a photojournal status with his webs and super-strength and he abused that nower.

As a professor, I am relieved to see that he was immediately acupht and punished for this transgression, and that it is being presented as unacceptable conduct. I very much hope that you do not plan to teach your readers that committing fraud is acceptable if you do it "for all the right reasons."

Once, when I caupht students cheating on a test, I told them that character was something that was built through the choices they made, and through what they learned from the mistakes that they made. From what I could see, those students seemed to work through a process, from denying their cheating, to trying to milnimize the consequences of their cheating, to trying to make something positive of the experience by volunteering with a group that promoted academic honesty.

At the end of issue #624, I hope Peter is in the early stages of a similar progression. He seems entirely focused on the external consequences for his career and his reputation, while still justifying his actions to himself. I very much hope that he admits to himself that he committed fraud, and that he comes to worry more about what that means to his ethical identity than about what it means to his career or to his relationships with his friends and family. The resolution of this arc CANNOT come in Peter's somehow "clearing" his name and restoring his career. The resolution MUST come in Peter's re-asserting his commitment to the responsible use of power--all power, not just superpower--and accepting the consequences of failing to live up to that responsibility.

Anything less would severely diminish Spider-Man's status as an icon of personal responsibility.
