## BACKSTORY

As many of you know (and some of you may not), before the current Spidey crew came on board, Spidey and his best girl Mary Jane had gone through a very traumatic story called *One More Day* by J. Michael Straczynski, and J.p. Quesada.

At the time, the status quo of the book was that Spider-Man and Mary Jane were married, Pete's identity as Spidey was known to the whole world, and -most importantly—Aunt May lay dying, having been struck down by an assassin's bullet (as a result of Spidey's public ID).

The dramatic-and still controversialevents of *One More Day* told the story of Mary Jane and Peter's last, desperate option to save their Aunt May.

In they end, they sacrificed their marriage to the Marvel villain Mephisto in return for his changing a single moment in time... a moment that would change everything... on marriage, an identity once again a secret and, most importantly, Aunt May healthy and alive. But that wasn't all, at the last second. Mary Jane whispered something to the metaphysical menace, scoring one last promise from him that has remained wrapped in shadows.

For months, the mysteries have remained:

How did that ONE thing affect Pete's wedding day?

How did that MOMENT help Pete's identity become a secret again?

What was it that Mary Jane whispered IN the ear of Mephisto?

For these four issues, the Spidey Web-Heads welcome De Guesada into the writer's chair (and the artist's chair as well for the present day scenes) for this special four-part story and we are also very excited to have Brooklyn's very own Paolo Rivera along for the ride. Paolo's done some stellar Spidey work over the past few years in this very book and it's always a treat when te stops by.

As you also may have noticed, Joe and Paolo have cleverly worked in pages from the original story where Peter Parker and Mary Jane were married (in 1937's ASM Annual #21), so we thank those original creators as well since we clearly wouldn't have this story without theirs. As much as fans over the years have debated whether or not MJ and Pete should have gotten married in that seminal story, there's no doubt that it made for some exiting and well-crafted comics. (If you haven't read that original story, you can find it in its entirely in the MARVEL WEDDINGS trade paperback collection.)

So here we are, friends. Longtime readers of Amazing have been waiting for this story for awhile and we hope you new readers enjoy it as well.

Last issue we ran a letter from Matthew Giannandrea, Ph.D. taking issue with some of our science we used in a recent story featuring Electro. Here's an excerpt:

I'm talking specifically about the use of "custom-engineered bacteriophages that are linked to the carbon atoms in Dillion's body to amplify his battery capacity".

Bacteriophages do not bind to carbon atoms. Bateriophages are made of proteins which are capable of interacting with other proteins, but proteins cannot specifically interact with one particular type of atom. Protein / protein interactions ARE governed by interactions of atoms, but it's the atoms carrying extra charges (Nitrogen, Oxygen, Calcium, Metals, etc) that are primarily responsible for the phenomenon. How carbon atoms could be related to Electo's battery capacity, is beyond me.

There is thought of using phages as gene therapy vectors, which could have worked well for some genetic sort of explanation. Alternatively, a surgery to graft some sort of superconducting material that would keep Electro's current from dying would also maintain at least a realistic logic to the science fiction. If there was some sort of deeper reason for the use of bacteriophage, please let me know.

If you're anything like me, you were lost after the third word (anything over two syllables tends to baffle us knuckle-dragging types), but here comes the writer of the Electro story, Mark Waid, ready to help with an answer that's actually useful:

Thanks for writing, doc! Actually, the core notion for the entire Electro story began with a brief conversation with Angela Belcher, a legendary professor at MIT (look her up so you can be properly impressed by my shameless name-dropping!) who's the Einstein of cutting-edge name-electronics.

Recently, she's been involved in the creation of M13, a unique virus that allows carbon nanotubes and bits of iron phosphate to join into a network for conducting electricity. In other words, she's helped create a bacteriophage that can, in fact, bind with carbons, at least secondarily—and I look the leap that, in the Marvel Universe, someone like the Mad Thinker could integrate that into Electro's biochemistry.

Granted, in order not to force our overworked letterer to fit an entire treatise into one panel, I had ol' M.T. shorthand the language a tiny bit, and I apologize if anything got lost in the translation, but there you go.

And thanks for asking, seriously! Wacker's convinced my knowledge of science is limited to what I read on the inside of Snapple caps, so it's fun to be able to prove him wrong.

Like I said: It has so much potential.

And one question regarding the word "potential". Pete's creed is about great power and great responsibility, yet he has not tapped into his full potential, thus not maximizing the full extent of his responsibility.

He's never attempted to train himself as a fighter or as an investigator. He simply relies on the abilities granted to him back in 1963. Why is he not maximizing his potential with all that has been granted to him?
